Annual Awards Banquet & Program **Salutes Exceptional Safety Records**

Companies and organizations of all sizes and types of industries will be recognized in four separate categories at the awards luncheon.

Ten companies will be honored with group awards. The awards are presented to companies or organizations with the best safety record in their industry group at the Friday, April 7 event.

Thirty companies will be saluted for their level of safety improvement—awarded to companies or organizations that reduce their accident rate by 25 percent or more over the previous year.

There will be 20 special awards presented. These are for companies and organizations that worked at least 500,000 hours and six (6) months without a lost-time injury.

And finally, more than 90 companies or organizations will be acknowledged with 100 percent awards. These awards are for firms that worked the entire year without a lost-time injury.
